The Prophet Muhammad (saw) said in the hadith I have read, **"Those who are content with Allah as their Lord, with Islam as their religion, and with Muhammad as their Prophet has found the taste of faith (iman)."**²

Dear Believers!

Allah the Exalted (swt), the one and only Owner of the earth and the heavens, has created human in a perfect form. He has bestowed upon them a mind to distinguish between right and wrong, and a conscience to guide them on the path to goodness. As a strong and conscious being with free will and sense of responsibility, human is the treasure of the universe.

Allah the Almighty (swt), who has created human from nothing, bestows upon them blessings to feed them, and protects them, and wants them to have faith and do good deeds. The reason for the existence of humans is to bear the *amanah* as a servant, and to make the world a peaceful, fair, and livable home for humanity.

Dear Muslims!

Humankind has quite superior qualities, privileged power and abilities. They can intend to do good and manage life in a good way thanks to those qualities. But they can also desire evil and spread cruelty around the world. As they can build a happy world with their patient, determined, peaceful and fair attitudes, they can also endanger both themselves and their surroundings with their ignorant, selfish, ambitious, hasty, and ungrateful attitudes.

Therefore, our Lord (swt) never gives rein to human. He has not abandoned the universe after creating it. Allah (swt) always sees, looks after, and manages. He never leaves human alone, deprived of blessings, and helpless in the life. He is with us each moment; closer to us than our jugular vein. The greatest support of Allah the Almighty (swt) to us is the guidance He gives us through His Prophet and His Book.

Dear Believers!

The divine law that is sent by Allah (swt) to humanity as a guide, a light of life, and a source of salvation which invites men of understanding to accept the guide of salvation brought by our Prophet is called religion. Religion came into being with the first human, and will exist until the last day. We all know as believers who came together in this holy masjid in this hour of Friday that **"The Religion before Allah is Islam."**³ All humans until the Day of Resurrection are obliged to be one of the Ummah of our Beloved Prophet (saw), and to respond to his invitation. Because, **"If anyone desires a religion other than Islam, never will it be accepted of him; and in the Hereafter he will be in the ranks of those who have lost (all spiritual good)."⁴**

Religion is the soundest source of knowledge where people can find answers to their questions, and solutions to their problems. Those who believe by responding the invitation of the religion have given the best decision of their life. They have been honored by becoming Muslims. They turned to Allah (swt) with their own choice voluntarily without being forced. They have sincerely accepted the commands and prohibitions of Him. From that moment on, they are expected to fulfill the requirements of their faith, and to live as a believer does.

Dear Muslims!

Islam is a unique system of faith, worship, and أَشْهَدُ أَنْ لَاإِلَهَ إِلَّا اللَّهُ وأَشْهَدُ أَنَّ مُحَمَّداً عَبْدُهُ ورَسُولُهُ morality. Taking the kalimah al-shahadah by uttering these words is to open the gate to faith, hope, and happiness both for the world and the Hereafter. Those who enter through this gate perform their prayers regularly and meticulously. Prayer (salah) is the pillar of our religion and the light of our hearts. They fast zestfully and patiently. Fasting is the shield protecting us from being captive to our nafs and to Satan. They pay their alms (zakat) sincerely and kindly. Zakat is the bridge turning the ephemeral worldly belongings into eternal gain and brotherhood. They fulfill their duty of hajj devotedly and submissively. Hajj is the holy journey which makes people meet with themselves and other faithful hearts around the Ka'bah.

The aim of worship in Islam is to enable people to establish a sound communication with themselves, with Allah (swt), and with all other beings. For this reason, each worship requires to be completed with good morality. A way of life befitting to Muslims can be lived by observing the moral principles as well as the worships. It is an indispensable requirement of being Muslim to observe the rights, to not let cruelty and oppression, to spread mercy and prevent violence. Making life blessed with justice, honesty, humbleness and generosity is the essential of a Muslim's personality. Let us not forget that those whose minds are with the truth, whose hearts are with goodness and whose possibilities are with beneficial deeds will fulfill the requirement of their faith.



SOME DU'AS IN THE WORDS OF PROPHET **MUHAMMAD (SAW)**

Honorable Muslims!

In this temporary world we have some days we show gratitude for the blessings we are bestowed upon and some other days we show patience for the troubles we have to endure. We try our best to welcome sorrow and hardships as would be appropriate for a Muslim just like we do so when it comes to success and happiness. We are blessed with a unique blessing that strengthen our faith in and reliance upon Allah (swt), gives us hope and a spirit to try better. That blessing is what is the essence of the whole worships: du'a.

It is our sincere entreaty and appeal to Allah (swt). It is our confession that we are weak before His omnipotent power. It is our seeking refuge in His grace and forgiveness. It is our submission of servitude to Him and asking help from Him.

Dear Believers!

In the verse I recited as I began the khutbah the Almighty Allah (swt) states, "And when My servants ask you, o Muhammad, concerning Me - indeed I am near. I respond to the invocation of the supplicant when he calls upon Me. So let them respond to Me by obedience and believe in Me that they may be rightly guided."¹

One of the names of Allah (swt), al-Mujib, means the answerer of du'as. He is Who is closer to us than even our own self, and hears, knows and responds to all our du'as, whether implied or express.

Dear Muslims!

Prophet Muhammad (saw), in all actions of whom we see his love and loyalty to Allah (swt), was in a constant state of invocation to Him. Day or night, with people around or by himself, when happy, afraid, or sad, when lost in thoughts about the Hereafter, in his home, by the minbar of the masjid, during travel, in short in all instances of life he would make du'a. Du'a in his life was like threads interlaced in a piece of fabric. It was he who taught us how to make du'a.

Waking up in the morning, he would start his day with the following du'a, "O Allah! With Your Power we have come to the morning, with Your Power we come to the evening, with Your Power we live, and we die, and to You will we return."²

In observance of the approval of Allah (swt) all day long, he would always rely on and trust in Him, and pray, "O, Allah! Give me what is good for me and choose what is best for me."³

ٱللَّهُمَّ رَبَّنَا آتِنَا فِي الدُّنْيَا حَسَنَةً وَفِي الآخِرَةِ حَسَنَةً وَقِنَا عَذَابَ النَّارِ

"O, Allah! Grant us good both in this world and in the Hereafter. Save us from the torment of of hellfire!"⁴ was how he supplicated to Allah (swt).

When by gone is the day and down falls the night, he would pray, "O, Allah! I want from You the good out of what will happen tonight and in its aftermath. I seek refuge in You from the evil of what will happen tonight and in its aftermath."5When he would go to sleep, he would pray, "All praise and thanks be to You, Who provides us with food and drink, covers our needs and shelters us while there are countless people who has no place for accommodation and no person to provide for them."6

Dear Believers!

Du'a is the servant's search for refuge in Allah (swt) for remedy to sorrows, for protection from all evils, and for safety against troubles whether visible or invisible. In this respect Prophet Muhammad (saw) would seek refuge in Allah (swt) as follows: "O, Allah! Verily, I seek refuge in You from weakness, laziness, senility (of old age), cowardliness, stinginess and the torment of the grave. Give my soul its good and purify it, for You are the best to purify it. You are its Guardian and Master. Verily, I seek refuge in You from a heart that is not humble, a soul that is not satisfied, knowledge that does not benefit and a supplication that is not answered."7

Honorable Muslims!

Muslims should never give in to the thought that their supplication is not responded to. In this respect, Prophet Muhammad (saw) states, "The supplication of every one of you will be granted if he does not get impatient and say, 'I supplicated to Allah, but my prayer has not been granted."8 This is because sometimes Allah (swt) gives us countless blessings for the sake of our du'a. Some other times He takes our troubles away. Sometimes He forgives our sins. Some other times He gives us something better than what we actually want.

Let us then have faith that all our heartfelt du'as will be certainly responded to. Let us not be bereft of abundance of divine blessings, peace, and confidence. Let us not forget to pray for our families, loved ones, Muslim brothers and sisters, and the oppressed, as much as we pray for our own selves. Let us try to deserve the du'a of our parents, the patients, the elderly, and those people in need.

I would like to conclude this khutbah with Prophet Muhammad's (saw) following du'a:

Honorable Muslims!

Islam primarily aims to ensure that the lives, properties, mental health, dignity, and faith of human, created to be the most honorable being on earth, are protected. It regards these five values inviolable. It does not approve in any manner these values being undermined for any reason. Binding all spheres of life, this fact is also applicable to using technology, and the Internet and social media.

Dear Believers!

What fits a Muslim is to use the technology properly as approved by the religion, ethics, and common sense. To consider the Internet as a purposeless, useless and uncontrolled medium means to violate the five fundamental values Islam wants protected. This is because the inconsiderate use of technology harms human life by exposing threat to human health and inflicts costly damage to property by causing financial loss. It erodes human dignity through unethical orientations and human faith through radical and perverse ideologies. It impairs the ability to think and comprehend, and challenges the mental faculties.

Dear Muslims!

People who produce technology using the reason and material given by Allah (swt) are accountable to use it in good cause. By using technology if they go after gambling instead of halal earning, extravagance instead of moderate spending, morally ill practices instead of honorably living, and violence instead of compassion, then greatly mistaken are they. It means they spread sedition by their own hands, and put their future in danger. Moreover, if they kill their time behind a television or computer screen, then they become accountable against themselves, their families, and Allah (swt). It is unfortunate that the number of families living under the same roof unaware of each other is increasing day by day. The technology, expected to buy time by speeding up the processes for human, has turned into the most deceiving trap for waste and loss of time today. Prophet Muhammad (saw), however, warned us as follows, **"There are two blessings that many people lose: Health and free time."**¹

Dear Believers!

Occupying a great place in the lives of everyone, the Internet and social media should be prevented from turning into an area uncontrolled, unprincipled, and free of responsibility. What suits a Muslim is to always act responsibly observing the boundaries set by Allah (swt), and to uphold the truth and the right at all times. Let us not forget that just as in the offline life, it is haram to violate the rights and privacy of people on the social media as well. Any step in disrespect of privacy of people contradicts the divine commandment of Allah (swt), "Do not spy or backbite each other."² Just as it is a sin to tell a lie, defame people, and utter slanders at them in offline life, it is also a sin to do so online. Allah (swt) as the Lord of the Worlds watches us over online, too. He will bring us to account for all our words and acts online, too. In the verse I recited as I began the khutbah, Allah (swt) states, "Do not pursue that of which you have no knowledge. Indeed, the hearing, the sight and the heart - about all those one will be questioned."3

Dear Muslims!

Today it is not possible to live in a way completely isolated from technology. In fact, Islam does not want such a thing either. However, it is the primary responsibility of all of us to use the technology as aware of halal-haram, paying attention to protecting moral principles, without violating human rights and liberties. That way we might have more productive time and more meaningful efforts. We might render the world better and peaceful... As long as we use the technology in accordance with the limits and boundaries set by Allah (swt) as in all His blessings.

TO BE A RESPONSIBLE FATHER Honorable Muslims!

Being a family is one of the greatest blessings granted for human by Allah (swt). This is so because family means trust, shelter, and refuge. It refers to joining hands all together to foster the good and prevent the evil. It is also the most important institution that prepares human for the future. The first education ever is given within family. Within family is formed the personality. Before everyone else, from parents are taught love, respect, and honesty.

Important duties fall upon the father in family as well as the mother. A father's responsibility is not limited to the financial satisfaction of the family's material needs only. It is the primary responsibility of all fathers to rear children who are aware of the significance of mercy, equipped with good morals and values. In the hadith I recited as I began the khutbah, Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, **"No father can leave a better heritage to his children than good** manners."¹

Dear Believers!

To be a father means to strive that his child is honored with iman, like Prophet Nuh. It is to make every effort so that the child could be happy in this world and in the Hereafter. Prophet Nuh called out to his son, who refused to get aboard the ship to tawhid, with his final hope, "...O my son, come aboard with us and be not with the disbelievers."²

Dear Muslims!

To be a father means to be in a state of constant supplication like Prophet Ibrahim. It is to seek refuge with Allah (swt) to be an obedient servant of His. It is to pray earnestly to Him (swt) for good children. In this respect, Prophet Ibrahim prayed to Allah (swt) as, "Our Lord! Make us Muslims in submission to You and from our descendants a Muslim nation in submission to You. And show us our rites and accept our repentance. Indeed, You are the Accepting of repentance, the Merciful."³ "O Allah! Make me an establisher of prayer, and many from my descendants. O Allah, accept my supplication."⁴

Dear Believers!

To be a father means to preserve one's perseverance in the face of hardships, like Prophet Yaqub. It is to bear the tests and trials of the world, however heavy they may be, with patience and reliance on Allah. It is to continuously instill love, mercy, justice, and compassion in one's children. It is to warn them when they fail, but not ever give up hope in them. Prophet Yaqub said to his children who, out of jealousy, threw their brother Yusuf in a well, "...Rather, your souls have enticed you to something, so patience is most fitting. And Allah is the one sought for help against that which you describe."⁵

Dear Muslims!

To be a father means to give advice to one's child in a compassionate manner, like Luqman. It is to teach them what is right and what is wrong, as well as what is haram and what is halal. Luqman advised his child so finely, "O my son, do not associate anything with Allah. Indeed, association with Him is great injustice." "O my son, establish prayer, enjoin what is right, forbid what is wrong, and be patient over what befalls you." "And do not turn your cheek in contempt toward people and do not walk through the earth exultantly. Indeed, Allah does not like anyone self-deluded and boastful." "And be moderate in your pace and lower your voice..."⁶

Dear Muslims!

To be a father means to follow the Sunnah of Prophet Muhammad (saw), who was sent as mercy to the worlds. He (saw) was an exemplary father. He would not make any discrimination among his children. Seeing his daughter Fatima, he would stand up, let her have his seat, kiss and hug her mercifully. He would treat considerately not only his own children but all children. Grown up under Prophet Muhammad's (saw) supervision, Anas said about him, **"I served him for ten years. He never said 'uff' to me."**⁷

Honorable Believers!

Our children expect care and compassion from us. They want to feel they are valued around us. They need us to be the compass guiding them on their way and the safe harbor taking shelter in as they learn the life. Then, let us not neglect our children in the busyness of the daily life and the rush of earning livelihood. Let us make every effort to raise children who help their religion, homeland, and all humanity. Let us not leave our children deprived of our love, care, and du'a for them.

We all rushed for those people who got injured and lost their homes. Once again we came face to face with the reality of natural disasters. We all wish the Almighty Allah's mercy upon our brothers and sisters who lost their lives in this calamitous event, may He grant their families and loved ones with the best of patience. May He bless the injured with a speedy recovery. May He enable the victims of the earthquake to recover, get better, and hold on to life soon. May He protect our people from such natural disasters.

Dear Believers!

The universe runs in an order based on the divine laws and rules called "Sunnat al-Allah". The Almighty Allah has put these laws in place with His omnipotent power and knowledge. Earth, air, water, and fire each has its specific nature and balance. People need to live in such a way as to protect such nature and balance.

Earthquakes, too, happen in accordance with the divine laws. People are not able to prevent earthquakes, nor are they able to change their time and magnitude. They can, however, take certain measures not to get harmed in them. Only by taking necessary measures is it possible to minimize the loss of life and property caused by natural disasters such as earthquakes, floods, and fires.

Dear Muslims!

The Almighty Allah states in the Holy Qur'an, "We will surely test you with something of fear and hunger and a loss of wealth and lives and fruits. Give good tidings to the patient!"¹ Muslims, then, live in the know that they will face various troubles in this world of tests and trials. They are aware of their limits and incapabilities, and are, as servants of Allah, in need of Him. They make every effort practicably possible to endure the troubles to come their way. They use their mind, knowledge, and experience, and take necessary precautions. Thereafter, they submit themselves to and rely on Allah (swt), as required by the iman they have. Even stronger than before, they come out of the troubles they are hit by through patience. They pass the divine test and trial by showing gratitude for the blessings and patience for the hardships. Prophet Muhammad (saw) describes this situation of Muslims as, "How wonderful is the case of a believer; there is good for him in everything and this applies only to a believer. If prosperity attends him, he expresses gratitude to Allah and that is good for him; and if adversity befalls him, he endures it patiently and that is better for him."²

Dear Believers!

What suits a Muslim is to have a sense of responsibility against natural disasters. What Allah (swt) has ordained is meant to happen; and, what falls upon us is to take necessary measures and rely on Him. In this respect, Prophet Muhammad (saw) describes the stance Muslims should have against troubles, "Allah dislikes negligence and idleness. You should behave reasonably. However, once there is nothing left that you can do, then say, "Sufficient is Allah for me He is the Best Dispessor of officient "

me. He is the Best Disposer of affairs.'''³

So, let us draw lessons from bitter experiences. Let us all get prepared against natural disasters for a safe and secure life. Let us make right and proper moves in accordance with the balances of the nature and the realities of the region we live in. Let us inform our family members on disasters and emergencies.

Dear Muslims!

Alhamdulillah, today, too, just as in the past, we heal our wounds together as a nation regardless of differences in faith, sects, ethnic origins, and ideologies. It is never enough to express our appreciation for the support of our state and the solidarity of our nation. Our noble, sacrificing, and generous nation are thankfully the addressee of the good news given by the Prophet Muhammad (saw), "Allah will help His slave so long as His slave helps his brother."⁴

AL-QUDS (JERUSALEM) IS AN ISLAMIC LAND AND BELONGS TO ISLAM Honorable Muslims!

One day Prophet Muhammad's wife Maymunah asked him, "Tell us something about Bayt al-Maqdis." He (saw) said, "That is the place of resurrection. Go and pray there! For one prayer performed there is like one thousand prayers performed elsewhere." When she asked him, "What if I cannot travel and go there?", he replied, "Then send a gift of olive oil to light its lamps. For whoever does that is like one who goes there."¹

Dear Believers!

Al-Quds is a universal value that bears witness to the most deeply-rooted human heritage. It is the symbol of a stance that reflects faith, a direction that is aligned with the divine revelation, and a turn towards affection. It is an Islamic city, home to countless memories of many prophets. The first qibla of Muslims, al-Masjid al-Aqsa, is there. In the hadith I recited as I began the khutbah, Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, "Mounts are not saddled for except to travel to three masjids for worship: Al-Masjid Al-Haram, this Masjid of mine, and al-Masjid Al-Aqsa."²

Dear Muslims!

Al-Quds is referred to as "dar al-salam (Jerusalem)", namely the land of peace. Al-Quds has been the symbol of freedom and justice under the Muslim rule for centuries. It was ruled as a land on which not only Muslims but also all people of any faith could freely perform their worships and live in peace.

Since its invasion and occupation, however, al-Quds has lost its peaceful and tranquil atmosphere. Al-Quds is woeful. Overshadowed by conflicts, insults, and oppression, al-Masjid al-Aqsa is in sorrow. This occupation actually targets the unity, solidarity, and sacred values of Muslims. It prevents Muslims from worshipping in their own land and in their own mosques. However, in the Holy Qur'an it is stated of those who damage the masjids of Allah and prevent Muslims from worshipping, "And who are more unjust than those who prevent the name of Allah from being mentioned in His mosques and strive toward their destruction. It is not for them to enter them except in fear. For them in this world is disgrace, and they will have in the Hereafter a great punishment."³

Dear Believers!

To occupy Palestine and al-Quds means actually to prevent peace not only in the region but also across the world by creating chaos. To fuel the turmoil and feed on war-waging means actually to turn one's back on mercy, conscience, and compassion. To force Muslims out of al-Quds, a city that has throughout the history embraced all humanity, means actually to disregard the laws, rights and honor of all humanity.

Dear Believers!

Allah the Almighty is the only reason for our existence. Upon His command "Be!", all creations between heavens and earth find their place in the world. It is Allah, Who creates us from nothing, makes us live through His might, bounty and help, and puts us to a test through His blessings.

We are responsible against Allah, from the moment we wake up in the morning till we go to sleep at night, in every breath and every step we take, and in every decision we make. Prophet Muhammad (saw) refers to this responsibility in one occasion, "The right of Allah over His slaves is that they should worship Him and not associate anything with Him." Then they show they believe in tawhid and build their lives based on it. Then Allah promises them, "He shall not punish them, and He shall put them in paradise."³

Dear Muslims!

When the servants of Allah have sincere faith in Him, He becomes pleased with them. Having sincere faith requires wholeheartedly worshipping and living in accordance with good morals. Muslims show their love, respect, and obedience to Allah not only through worships but also their moral behaviors.

Allah responds to the prayers and supplications of His believing servants. He (swt) does not leave those, who try to obtain His consent, alone and unaided. Whenever His servants ask,

مَتْى نَصْرُ اللهِ "When is the help of Allah?", He

(swt) welcomes their question with, اَلَا إِنَّ نَصْرَ اللَّهِ قَرِيبٌ

"Unquestionably, the help of Allah is near."⁴ In a hadith qudsi, Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, "I am just as My servant thinks I am, (i.e. I am able to do for him what he thinks I can do for him) and I am with him if He remembers Me. If he remembers Me in himself, I too, remember him in Myself; and if he remembers Me in a group of people, I remember him in a group that is better than them. If he comes one span nearer to Me, I go one cubit nearer to him; and if he comes one cubit nearer to Me, I go a distance of two outstretched arms nearer to him; and if he comes to Me walking, I go to him running."⁵

Dear Believers!

People can sometimes be ungrateful and egoistic, and pushy and careless. We are merely servants. Sometimes we happen to forget that Allah sees, hears, and expects good deeds from us at all times. We find ourselves committing sins, and making mistakes, knowingly or forgetfully. We happen to do things we would greatly regret when the dark clouds set down on our way, when our foot slips, and when our eyes are closed.

No matter what, our only shelter is Allah, Who is the Most Merciful of all the Merciful. Allah is forgiving and loves to forgive. He (swt) keeps open the door of mercy and forgiveness until our last breath. It is stated in the Holy Qur'an, "O My servants who have transgressed against themselves [by sinning], do not despair of the mercy of Allah. Indeed, Allah forgives all sins. Indeed, it is He who is the Forgiving, the Merciful."⁶

Dear Muslims!

Allah warns us in the Qur'an, "And be not like those who forgot Allah, so He made them forget themselves."⁷ Let us heed this warning. Let us properly protect and strengthen the bond of servitude between Allah and us. Let us duly worship Him and let us ask for help from Him (swt) only. Let us wholeheartedly pray to Him. Let us repent for all our sins. Let us not forget that if we forget Allah and lose our bond with Allah, then He pushes us away from His mercy. Dear Muslims!

The Prophet Muhammad (saw) received a revelation for the first time in the Cave of Hira. Overwhelmed with the heaviness of the duty he assumed, he returned home, and asked his beloved wife Khadijah, "Cover me!" She put a garment on him to cover, tried to calm him down, and uttered comforting words. A while later, Allah the Almighty revealed the following verses, "O you who covers himself with a garment. Arise and warn. And glorify your Lord. purify vour clothing. And And avoid uncleanliness."1

Dear Believers!

These first verses of the Surah al-Muddaththir tell Prophet Muhammad (saw) to keep his clothing and body clean in the material sense, and purify himself in the spiritual sense by avoiding superstitions and committing sins. This is because cleanliness, which is one of the most fundamental qualities of Muslims, denotes having a clean body, clothes free from dirt, as well as a peaceful heart. Therefore, the Prophet Muhammad explains the relation between cleanliness on the outside and faith in heart as follows, **"Cleanliness makes up half of the faith."**²

Dear Muslims!

People who are not clean and who wear unclean clothes, have disorderly hair and beard, and untidy homes although they have the necessary means to clean themselves are not only welcome by other people but also by Allah (swt). This is because it is only possible through being clean to duly worship Allah and obtain His approval. Let us not forget that wudu and ghusl make up a unique system of cleanliness and the prerequisite for many worships, particularly salah. Paying due attention to cleanliness after using the toilet, mouth and nail care, and having a bath at least once a week on Fridays are among the Sunnah of our Prophet (saw).

Allah's love encompasses clean, pure, and pious people. In this respect, it is stated in the Holy Qur'an, "...A mosque founded on righteousness from the first day is more worthy for you to stand in. Within it are men who love to purify themselves; and Allah loves those who purify themselves."³

When Prophet Muhammad asked the people of Quba', praised in the above verse, **"How do you purify yourselves that Allah praises you in the Qur'an?"**, they replied "We use water to clean ourselves off any impurity."⁴

Dear Believers!

On top of every good and nicety comes being healthy, and being healthy requires being clean. Today epidemics wander the earth, just as in the past. Viruses that threaten all corners of the world cause mass casualties. Alhamdulillah, there has been no case identified in our country so far. We all have, however, our responsibilities to take care of ourselves and our loved ones.

Honorable Muslims!

Let us ensure that we have taken every measure to protect ourselves against the epidemic of coronavirus. Let us pay attention to the principles of cleanliness more than ever. Let us wash our hands with soap and water several times a day. Let us not touch our eyes, nose, or mouth if our hands are not clean. Let us stay hydrated for our body not to get weak. Let us follow a balanced diet and take enough sleep. Let us cover our mouth with a piece of tissue while sneezing or coughing, or use the inside of our elbow otherwise. Let us keep well ventilated the indoors we live in. Let us stay away from alcohol, drugs or other harmful substances that are not only considered haram by the religion but also make our body prone to several diseases.

Honorable Muslims!

The Prophet Muhammad (saw) advises, **"Know** the value of your health before an illness."⁵ Sometimes we fail to heed this warning of him. We happen to better understand the value of having a healthy body only after we lose our health. However, it is our duty to live cleanly and protect our health. We need to take our precaution and then rely on Allah the Almighty for the rest. Let us not forget that our Prophet (saw) says, **"Allah is good, loves what is good; He is clean, loves cleanliness; He is generous, loves generosity."**⁶

In order to be safe from this pandemic, let us first pay attention to bodily, clothing, food, and environmental cleanliness. Let us frequently ventilate the places we live in. When we cough or sneeze, let us cover our mouth and nose with single-use tissues or with the inside of our elbow. Let us try to stay out of crowded places.

Let us keep clean particularly lavatories, toilets, places to perform ablution, door handles, and desktops with which our hands contact frequently. People above a certain age are in the risk group and more vulnerable to coronavirus. Therefore, our elderly people had better have a rest at their homes and avoid crowded places.

Dear Believers!

Health is a blessing entrusted to us by Allah (swt). What falls upon Muslims is to preserve what is entrusted to them and do their best to look after their health. This way we attain peace thanks to the help of Allah. And this way we find solutions to our problems and cure to our illnesses. In this respect, the Prophet Ibrahim (Abraham) speaks of Allah in the Holy Qur'an as follows: **"It is He who created me and guides me. It is He who feeds me and gives me drink. When I am ill, it is He who cures me. It is He who will cause me to die and then bring me to life.**"²

So, let us be precautious to look after our health and that of the people around us in the face of this pandemic. Let us not forget that, otherwise, we endanger both our health and that of others, which means a violation of their rights.

Closed for a while due to the pandemic disease, the doors of our mosques also open to our glorious nation and our dear congregation today. We live the vigor of the conquest and the joy of being able to go to our mosques at the same time. Let us know the value of this great blessing. Let us not forget our responsibility. Let us duly observe the measures.

Now, with the permission of Allah, we will perform the fardh rakats of the Friday prayer. Afterwards, we will leave from here without shaking hands, by paying attention to the physical/social distancing, and in compliance with the guidance provided by our officials. We will perform the sunnah rakats of the Friday prayer at our homes. May Allah the Almighty accept our worships. May He (swt) save us from this pandemic disease in the shortest time possible. I would like to conclude this khutbah with Prophet Muhammad's (saw) following du'a: **"O Allah! Help me to remember You, express gratitude to You, and worship You in the best manner!"**²

Honorable Muslims!

The Prophet Muhammad (saw) advises in the hadith I have recited, "A wise man is the one who calls himself to account (and refrains from doing evil deeds) and does noble deeds to benefit him after death; and the foolish person is the one who subdues himself to his temptations and desires and seeks from Allah the fulfillment of his vain desires."²

Dear Believers!

One of the fundamental principles of Islam is the belief in the Hereafter. It is to believe in the Last Day, the Resurrection, the Reckoning, and the eternal life. The belief in the Hereafter is a unique strength that influences one's intentions, words, behaviors and, in short, all moments and steps. Having an awareness of the Hereafter shapes a Muslim's life, their relations with family, neighbors, colleagues, and all beings in their surroundings, whether living or non-living. Muslims who wholeheartedly embrace the belief in the Hereafter observe the boundaries set out by Allah and the appreciation of Him (swt) in all their acts. They do good deeds (amal al-salih) as their faith requires and grow in maturity through high morality. They always call themselves to account. They refrain from uttering bad words and doing evil acts.

Muslims look at the universe in such a way as to draw lessons from it. They see life and death, health and illness, wealth and poverty, and joy and sorrow as part of a world full of tests and trials. All their experiences and the events they encounter mean an opportunity for benevolence and reward for them. They show gratitude for the blessings granted to them, which is more virtuous for them, as expressed by the Prophet Muhammad. They show patience with troubles, which is also more virtuous for them.³

Dear Muslims!

The last stop and destination of our journey of servitude is the life in the Hereafter. The Hereafter for us is our true homeland and eternal residence. It is the place where we will reap what we have sown in this world and definitely give account for everything, whether big or small, or good or evil. Then, let us live a life with the awareness that we will face the Day of Akhirah. Let us not neglect making our preparations for that great day. I would like to conclude the khutbah with the following verses of our Lord (swt), **"So whoever does an atom's weight of good will see it, and whoever does an atom's weight of evil will see it."⁴**

One of the Companions went near the Prophet Muhammad (saw) and said, "O Messenger of Allah! Give me a piece of advice about Islam so that I will not need to ask anybody else about it." Then, the Prophet Muhammad (saw) said, "Say, 'I have believed in Allah', and be steadfast."¹

Dear Believers!

Human's reason for existence is servitude to Allah, and the most important duty of human is to believe in the existence and oneness of Allah, and live steadfastly as required by such iman (faith). This is because once iman is absorbed in heart, it is manifested in feelings, thoughts, and behaviors. It leads one to the truth and truthfulness as well as honesty and steadfastness. Only then Muslims have a peaceful and honorable life. They become assured of troubles and sorrows both in this world and in the Hereafter. They attain taqwa and divine blessings.

Dear Muslims!

Istiqamah (the true path) means perseverance in faith and commitment to promises. It means to obey Allah the Almighty and follow the Prophet Muhammad (saw). It means to be the same on the inside and on the outside, and either seem as you are or be as you seem.

Istiqamah means to be clear of blasphemy and polytheism, and stay away from committing sins and going against Allah. It means to stay away from sedition and corruption, and fight against the extreme desires of the self and the whispers of the Satan.

Dear Believers!

Muslims on the true path do not make any concessions on righteousness. They do not bend their words and never tell a lie. They observe justice and do not gravitate towards injustice. They are well-intended and sincere, and are not ostentatious. They pay due diligence in their work and do it finely, and do not resort to deception. They, with their love and respect for the Creator, show mercy and compassion to the created beings and do not hurt any living being. In short, they live on the sirat al-mustaqim (the straight path). They see the consent of Allah greater than any gain or profit. They lead a life as aware that Allah (swt) sees and hears all things, concealed or open, and that He will call His servants to account.

I would like to conclude the khutbah with the following good news of our Lord (swt), "Indeed, those who have said, 'Our Lord is Allah,' and then remained on a right course there will be no fear concerning them, nor will they grieve."²

PURE INTENTIONS AND SINCERITY

Honorable Muslims!

In Islam, the recognition of faith, worship, and good behaviors in the sight of Allah (swt) depends on pure intentions and sincerity. Having an intention comes on top of every act and is the essence of servitude to Allah. It is the desire to obtain the appreciation of Allah (swt). Sincerity, on the other hand, refers to devoting one's faith and deeds to Allah only. It means that one is the same on the inside and on the outside, as well as demonstrating the same qualities in one's intentions and behaviors.

Dear Believers!

Intentions and deeds are like soul and body that complete one another. What distinguishes praying from physical movements, fasting from remaining hungry and thirsty, and hajj and umrah from traveling is one's intention.

Sincere are Muslims in their faith. They wholeheartedly obey the divine commandment, "Indeed, We have sent down to you the Book, [O Muhammad], in truth. So worship Allah, [being] sincere to Him in religion."¹ They worship Allah only, and only Him they ask for help. They live as aware that their Lord oversees and is near them always. Sincere are Muslims in their worship. They express gratitude for the blessings of Allah with their tongues, bodies, and hearts. They confess how weak they are in the face of His might and magnificence. They remain loyal and committed to the verse, "Say, "Indeed, my prayer, my rites of sacrifice, my living and my dying are for Allah, Lord of the worlds."²

Sincere are Muslims against people in their surroundings. They establish good relations with their families, relatives, and neighbors. They have a smiling face, speak the truth, and are humble. They have a sense of loyalty and are helpful. They spread trustworthiness and honesty. They prevent evil. They stand by oneness and unity and stand against discord. In short, Muslims live in accordance with good intentions and sincerity in every sphere of their lives.

Dear Believers!

In this respect, the Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, "Allah does not accept any deed except that which is purely for Him and for His sake."³

Right! The value of people's deeds and actions are measured by their intentions. Everybody gets the reward of their deeds depending on their intentions.⁴ Deeds done insincerely have no value before Allah (swt). Let us not forget that only through good intentions and sincerity can people attain the deliciousness of faith, the awe of worship, the peacefulness of good deeds, and the appreciation of Allah the Almighty (swt). I would like to conclude today's khutbah with the Prophet Muhammad's following supplication: "O Allah, the Lord of all things! Make me and my family sincerely devoted to You in this world and in the Hereafter."⁵

Dear Believers!

It means discernment, making the effort to carry on living without heeding the whispers of the Satan and falling for the desires of the nafs. 

In the hadith I have just read, the Prophet Muhammad (saw) states, with reference to the first day of the Eid al-Adha, as follows: **"Today,** we will first perform the eid prayer, and then return to perform the worship of qurbani. Whoever does so indeed performs our sunnah."²

Dear Believers!

Today is the Eid al-Adha that strengthens our faith, unites our hearts, and increases our gratitude. Today is the day when the worship of qurbani is performed, and supplications and efforts are consolidated with piety and submission. Endless thanks and praises be to Allah the Almighty (swt) who has enabled us to welcome this exceptional day. Salat and salam be to Prophet Muhammad (saw) who declared days of eid to be days of peace and joy.

Dear Muslims!

As in all forms of worship we perform, our goal in performing the worship of qurbani is to express our servitude, praise, and reverence to our Lord (swt). It is to acquire the sense of piety and hope to be included among the people who have attained the appreciation of Allah. We will perform the worship of qurbani with this sense insha Allah. We will take as example for ourselves Prophet Ibrahim's loyalty to his promise and Prophet Ismail's submission to Allah.

Dear Believers!

On Eid al-Adha this year, we need to pay better attention to cleanliness and hygiene more than ever. We need to recall Prophet Muhammad's (saw) hadith, **"Cleanliness makes up half of the faith."**³, and act with sensitivity as would suit a Muslim. In these days when we fight against the coronavirus pandemic, we have to observe the measures, and protect ourselves and our environment while sincerely performing our worships.

Dear Brothers and Sisters!

The animals to be sacrificed as qurbani are entrusted to us. Let us not hurt them. Let us treat them with mercy and care.

Days of eid are days of joy. Let us join our neighbors, relatives, the sick, the elderly, and the lonely brothers and sisters in this joy. Let us put an end to hard feelings and resentments on these blessed days. Let us all enjoy the peacefulness of the eid. But let us also not cause the spread of diseases and turn these valuable days into days of sorrow. Let us observe the mask-wearing and social distancing rules. Let us avoid handshaking and hugging on the days of eid and during the pandemic. Let us bear in mind that we must recite the tashrik takbir, starting from the morning prayer on the Day of Arafat and ending with the asr prayer on the fourth day of the Eid.

Dear Believers!

As I conclude this Eid al-Adha khutbah, I call on all of you to be considerate and patient in the performance of the worship of qurbani, in paying visits, and especially in traffic, during the eid. May our Lord Almighty (swt) protect us from all kinds of accidents and troubles. May He (swt) keep us clear of pandemic diseases, wars, and sufferings. May He (swt) enable us to come together again on many occasions of blessed eids. May Allah's (swt) peace, mercy, help and blessings be upon you! Eid Mubarak!

Honorable Muslims!

Endless thanks be to our Lord Almighty who deserves all kinds of thanks, praises, glories, and honors. Allah (swt) enabled us to enjoy anew the joy of welcoming Eid al-Adha and Friday. We performed the eid prayer and the worship of qurbani in comprehension of the fact that we, with all our material and spiritual selves, demand His appreciation. We are enjoying the divine abundance of blessings of the eid together with all Muslims on the face of the earth.

Dear Believers!

Every year until this year, our joy of the eid would be accompanied by the chants of "Labbayk, Allahumma labbayk" by our pilgrimages. But this year we could not go to Bayt Allah, Arafat, Muzdalifah, and Mina. Our prospective pilgrims are saddened, our hearts broken. We pray to Allah that He (swt) may enable us, as soon as possible, to go to those holy places in health, wellness, and safety; and perform tawaf around the Ka'bah and attain peace by the Masjid al-Nabawi.

Dear Muslims!

In order to sooth our longing for the holy lands even a little, let us recall our Prophet's Farewell Pilgrimage (Hajj al-Wada) today. Let us take a look at some of the timeless messages that he (saw) bequeathed to all humanity in the khutbas he delivered during the Farewell Pilgrimage. Let us all contemplate and attain ease of heart as if living that moment again.

Dear Believers!

Addressing a large mass at Arafat, the Prophet of Mercy (saw) first extended thanks and praises to Allah (swt) and said:

"O people! Know it well that your Lord is one and your father is one. You all are from Adam, and Adam is from dirt. The Arab has no superiority over the non-Arab nor the non-Arab over the Arab nor the white over the black nor the black over the white. The superiority in the presence of Allah is by piety and piety alone.

"Verily! Your blood, property and honor are sacred to one another (i.e. Muslims) like the sanctity of this day of yours (arafa), in this month of yours (Dhu al-Hijjah) and in this city of yours (Mecca)."

That day, Prophet Muhammad (saw) declared that he trodden down all kinds of interest and blood feud.

From centuries ago, he warned Muslims about the women's rights, their respectability, and inviolability by stating, "Beware! Just like you have rights over women, they have rights over you."

Let us continue with the Farewell Sermon:

"O people! Listen to me in earnest. Learn that every Muslim is a brother to every Muslim. Nothing shall be legitimate to a Muslim which belongs to a fellow Muslim unless it was given freely and willingly. Do not do injustice... Whatever is borrowed should be returned, and all debts should be paid off. Return the goods entrusted to you to their rightful owners."¹

"I leave behind me two things, the Qur'an and my example, the Sunnah, and if you follow these you will never go astray."²

Dear Muslims!

These honorable words make the Final Prophet's bequest to humanity, entrustment to his ummah, and the assurance of a safe future. And the guidance for our lives filled with the love of him... I would like to conclude this Friday's khutbah with the following verse: "Say [O Muhammad]! 'If you should love Allah, then follow me, [so] Allah will love you and forgive you your sins.' For Allah is the Oft-Forgiving and Most Merciful.""³

A MUSLIM SENSITIVITY: ENJOINING THE GOOD AND FORBIDDING THE EVIL

Honorable Muslims!

What lies in the essence of the creation of universe and the relations in the world of existence is the good and benevolence. Accordingly, Islam, our sublime religion, was revealed to ensure that good prevails on and evil is removed from the face of the earth.

A Muslim needs to be a good person, a truthful servant of Allah (swt), and a virtuous individual. But at the same time there is also the responsibility to reflect on the society their inherent good intentions and their spirit to fight against evil. That responsibility is called "amr bi al-ma'ruf wa nahy an al-munkar", which means to enjoin the good and forbid the evil.

The Almighty Allah (swt) describes the Muslim ummah, consisting of believing, conscientious, and sensible members, in the Qur'an as follows: **"You are the best nation produced [as an example] for mankind. You enjoin what is right and forbid what is wrong and believe in Allah.**"¹

Dear Believers!

Faith and good are inseparable parts of each other. **"The essence of virtue is good morals."**, as expressed by the Prophet Muhammad (saw).² Therefore, all that there is to good morals, such as justice, respect, honesty, loyalty, and tolerance, etc. are related to the good. A Muslim is a representative of the good. On the one hand, they keep the good alive with their behaviors and, on the other hand, invite others to the good by using a tongue of wisdom, good advice, and authentic knowledge. By heeding Prophet Muhammad's advice, they make

life easier and not difficult, and they give good tidings and not repulse them.³

They have good thoughts (husn al-dhann) about their Muslim brothers and sisters, and know that it is a requirement of faith to think good and speak good. They assume positive intent in others and treat them compassionately. They uphold purity, honesty, and righteousness in all spheres of life.

They make the utmost effort in their power for evils to disappear. They do not turn a blind eye to evil, nor do they corrupt their tongues with lies and slanders, their minds with bad suspicion. They do not believe in unfounded claims that feed wood to the flames of sedition and gossip. For they know that people's honor and dignity are entrusted to one another. And any betrayal of entrustment is a branch of evil.

Dear Muslims!

Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, **"Whosoever** of you sees an evil, let him change it with his hand; and if he is not able to do so, then [let him change it] with his tongue; and if he is not able to do so, then with his heart — and that is the weakest manifestation of faith."⁴

So, let us always enjoin the good and prevent the evil to the extent that our knowledge, experience, means and capabilities allow. Let us not forget that this is a religious obligation and human duty upon each one of us. Let us have the heartfelt belief that every step we take in the cause of enjoining the good and preventing the evil will have its merits.

Honorable Muslims!

As I conclude this Friday's khutbah, I would like to remind you of an important issue. Let us not fail to observe the measures in the fight against the pandemic so as to protect our health and that of our loved ones and the society. Let us not downplay the pandemic and let us show due care. Let us strictly and steadfastly observe the mask-wearing, social distancing, and hygiene rules. Let us not make it harder for our selflessly working brothers and sisters for our own good, health, and safety. Let us not forget that neglect and failure in such an important matter as this will hold us responsible both towards other people and towards Allah the Almighty.

WITH GRATITUDE COMES PEACE

Honorable Muslims!

One night while performing prayer, Prophet Muhammad (saw) cried so much that the tears running down his beard reached his chest and fell off to the ground. Seeing this, Aisha (ra) was surprised and asked him, "O Messenger of Allah! Allah the Almighty forgave your past and future sins. Why do you still cry?" Thereupon replied the Prophet Muhammad, "Should I not be a servant of Allah who shows gratitude to Him?"¹

Dear Believers!

The sense of gratitude behind Prophet Muhammad's tears means to know the value of favor done and reciprocate a favor with another favor. Gratitude embedded in the meaning of prayer means to comprehend that the true owner of all blessings, material or spiritual, is Allah the Almighty. Gratitude constantly expressed in a servant's words means to admit being indebted for the blessings by obeying Allah from deep in heart and staying away from committing sins.

Dear Muslims!

Allah the Almighty states in the Holy Qur'an as follows: **"So remember Me and I shall remember** you; give thanks to Me and do not be ungrateful to Me for My favors!"²

Allah is al-Wahhab, al-Razzaq, al-Malik, and al-Karim. Every human being, whether young or old, rich or poor, strong or weak, sustain their lives only through the means and offerings bestowed by Allah (swt). It is an indispensable requirement of being a believing servant of Allah to be aware of this fact, to know its value, and to express gratitude to the Owner of Blessings.

A Muslim feels, expresses, and demonstrates his gratitude to Allah thoroughly. They are thankful in heart, and know that they are indebted to Allah by always feeling Him in their hearts. They express their gratitude in words by always praising Allah. They demonstrate their gratitude physically by using their hands, tongues, eyes, and ears in good and keeping them clear off any kind of evil.

They know that the gratitude for mind is expressed through having faith and producing beneficial knowledge; gratitude for knowledge through teaching and implementing what is known; gratitude for wealth through sharing it with those in need; and for health through making all the efforts to become a benevolent human.

Dear Believers!

The Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, **"Those who do not thank people do not show gratitude to Allah.**"³ Then, a Muslim never underrates a favor done to them, nor do they show ungratefulness or arrogance. They get happy by giving thanks to all people who have done a favor for them, including primarily their parents, their spouses, and their children.

Dear Muslims!

Allah is al-Shakur, Who rewards any beneficial work done. He (swt) loves the servants who are not desirous and greedy but on the contrary are contented and satisfied with the available blessings. I would like to conclude this Friday's khutbah with a verse expressing this truth: **"Also call to mind when your Lord proclaimed: "If you give thanks, I will certainly grant you more; but if you are ungrateful for My favours, My chastisement is terrible."**⁴

MUSLIMS: REPRESENTATIVES OF RIGHTEOUSNESS AND INVITERS TO TRUTH

Honorable Believers!

Our Lord Almighty (swt) states in the Holy Qur'an as follows: **"O you who covers himself** [with a garment], arise and warn! And your Lord glorify."¹ The verses above that were revealed on the first days of Islam in Mecca call on the Prophet Muhammad (saw) to ready himself and rise, assume responsibility and communicate Islam, the religion of tawhid, to people. The name of this sacred duty that the Prophet Muhammad honorably assumed and bequeathed to his ummah is called tabligh.

Dear Muslims!

Allah the Almighty wants us to continue the duty of tabligh with an awareness extending beyond time and place by stating, "And let there be [arising] from you a nation inviting to [all that is] good, enjoining what is right and forbidding what is wrong."² Then, we must invite people to the truth and righteousness undauntedly and tirelessly.

Allah the Almighty informs that tabligh requires common sense and sensitivity by stating, **"Invite to the way of your Lord with wisdom and good instruction, and argue with them in a way that is best.**"³ Then, we must employ a peasant discourse and behave patiently and politely while inviting people to the truth.

Dear Believers!

Each of us is as much tasked with the duty of tabligh as representation. Every Muslim is

responsible to live by the high values they disseminate, by firstly observing the boundaries of Islam in their own lives, and by being coherent in their words and actions. In this regard, our Lord's warning is quite clear: **"O you who have believed, why do you say what you do not do? Great is hatred in the sight of Allah that you say what you do not do."**⁴

Dear Muslims!

Our Lord states, "And who is better in speech than one who invites to Allah and does righteousness and says, 'Indeed, I am of the Muslims.""⁵

Let us make the utmost effort to tell about the unshakable truths of the sublime religion Islam and live by them in order to be the addressee of the above appraisal. Let us take as example the Prophet Muhammad's method of tabligh who says, **"Make it easy, and not difficult. Give good news, and not cause hatred."**⁶ Let us act sensibly in our invitation and guidance efforts in order not to cause damage unintentionally while working to uphold the good through good intentions.

Dear Believers!

As I conclude this Friday's khutbah, I pray to Allah the Almighty that the Hijri year 1442 that started yesterday may bring along health, peace, and abundance of divine blessings for our great nation and all humanity. Also, I would like to point out to another issue that requires us to be sensible about. Let us behave in a way that would best suit a Muslim in order to protect both ourselves and the people around us from the pandemic disease facing us. Let us be role models with our carefulness and seriousness in observing the measures. Let us politely warn people against neglectful behaviors. Let us not forget that it is a great irresponsibility before Allah and a violation of the rights of other people to act carelessly while this disease, which we can beat together, is still among us.

Dear Muslims!

Dear Muslims!

Cleanliness means to attain beauty not only materially but also spiritually. To distance oneself from spiritual impurities that exhaust the soul and blacken the mirror of heart... To reach peace by keeping clean both our inner and outer world...

To abandon any wrongful attitude that makes us forget our servitude and reason for existence... To keep ourselves away from sin and haram... To purify ourselves from spiritual illnesses, such as anger and envy, grudge and hatred, lie and slander, and conceit and arrogance... To gravitate ourselves toward attaining the consent of Allah, good morals, and halal...

Dear Believers!

Muslims who make efforts to be spiritually purified also pay attention to their physical cleanliness. It is a virtue of Muslims to live clean and protect their health as something that is entrusted to them. Muslims who, by performing wudu (ablution), prepare for salah (prayer), which is the pillar of the religion and the apple of our eyes, happen to clean their limbs, which get dirtied the most, at least five times a day. Dear Believers!

Let us show our respect for our surroundings, love for our loved ones, and responsibility to Allah by observing the maskwearing and social distancing rules. Let us regard public health as valuable as that of our own. Let us not forget that neglect in taking and observing measures is an undesired act before Allah (swt).

In the verse I have recited, Allah the Almighty states, "And, [moreover], this is My path, which is straight, so follow it; and do not follow [other] ways, for you will be separated from His way. This has He instructed you that you may become righteous."¹

In the hadith I have read, the Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, "**The best discourse is Allah's Book. The best guidance is that given by Muhammad.**"²

Dear Believers!

Our sublime religion Islam is revealed to teach people about their Lord (swt), inform them of their reason for existence, and ensure their happiness in this world and in the Hereafter. Islam is a complete set of values and rules formed by the guidance of the the example Qur'an and of Prophet Muhammad (saw). Muslims have held on tightly to these values and endeavored to understand, tell about, and live by Islam correctly by conforming to these rules. From past to present, however, there have been people who have tried to exploit and abuse Islam, the religion of right, truth, and true path, for worldly interests and benefits.

Dear Muslims!

Exploitation of religion means to obtain material gain, power, fame, and high ranks through using the spiritual authority of the religion. Those who exploit religion attempt to have people's will handed over to them by claiming that they see and talk with Allah and the Prophet Muhammad. They try to show themselves as the single representative of the truth by uttering lies that they are infallible and innocent. They aim to manage pure and innocent Muslims with so-called karamah, dreams, bid'ah, and superstitions. They derive benefits from people's despair with promises to heal them and bring them good fortune and luck. They exploit the society's enthusiasm, dreams and ideals, religious beliefs and emotions particularly by targeting the youth.

Exploiters of religion ostracize those who do not think the way they do. They even otherize and declare polytheist those who do not show absolute obedience to them. They weaken family, national, cultural, and identity ties by conditioning people to be unquestionably obedient to them. They take lies, hypocrisy, theft, blackmailing, and violence as legitimate for their interests. In the end, they not only drift away from the true path but also make others go astray.

Dear Believers!

What falls upon each one of us is to act in an insightful and prudent manner. We need to stay alert to distinguish the exploitation attempts from sincere efforts. We need to learn and know the strong and reliable vessels of spirituality that have been feeding our religious life for hundreds of years. We must not forget that one of the aims of those who want to distort and exploit Islam is to damage the Anatolian wisdom.

It is also a fact that deceiving people through their faith and religious values is as much an exploitation of religion as bringing Muslims under suspicion through slanders, insults, and raising fear and hatred about Islam.

Dear Believers!

As the members and followers of the final and perfected religion, we are granted reason and will by Allah the Almighty (swt). We have unchangeable religious principles, cultural values, and a 14-century old strong tradition of knowledge and wisdom. Let us know their value and not waste our treasure. Let us learn about our religion from experts, well-intended and authentic sources in order to prevent exploitation. Let us take only the unalterable truths of the Holy Qur'an and Prophet Muhammad's sunnah as our measure.

hypocrisy, pomposity, deception, and unfairness! For sins and moral weaknesses cause barakah to disappear. Barakah is attained through submission to Allah, contentedness and gratefulness, righteousness and honesty, and humility and reliance on Allah.

Dear Muslims!

Faith, worships, good deeds, and good morals constitute the barakah of our life. The barakah of our heart is the Holy Qur'an. The barakah of our home is affection, love, and compassion. The barakah of our wealth is zakat, infaq, and sadaqah. The barakah of our business is honesty, the sweat of the brow, and halal earning. The barakah of our work is to work duly and diligently and to be selfless. The barakah of our knowledge is to apply our knowledge into our life and share it with others. The barakah of our time is to not waste it and rather use it by knowing its value. The barakah of our children is to raise them in such a way for them to be useful to Islam and humanity.

Dear Believers!

Allah the Almighty is the only source of barakah and the loftiest of the lofty. He (swt) is al-Dhu al-Jalal wa al-Ikram, the Mighty and Generous. Then, let us turn toward our Lord (swt), Who placed barakah in the essence of all existence, through our servitude, worship, supplication, and prayers. Let us search for peace and happiness not in what is abundant in quantity but in what is available in barakah. Let us not forget that if we base our intention on the consent of al-Rahman, then He (swt), the Owner of Power, will open the doors of barakah for us.

Mosques, where we submit our servitude to the Lord of Worlds, enable us to grasp the sense of oneness, unity, and brotherhood under the same dome. They strengthen our faith and hope with their minaret calling to tawhid and adhan to worship. We prostrate for the consent of Allah (swt) facing the same mihrab. Khutbah and sermons that enjoin the good and forbid the evil and teach about the truth of Islam give direction to our lives. The Prophet Muhammad (saw) gives glad tidings that peace and mercy would be rained over those who gather in one of the masjids of Allah, recite the Holy Qur'an, and discuss about it there.²

Dear Muslims!

The 1-7 October Week is celebrated as "the Mosques and Religious Officials Week" every year in Turkey. The theme of this year is "Mosques and Knowledge". Throughout the week we will remember again the place of mosques in our civilization and their meaning in our lives. We will remember with gratitude our sacrificing religious officials who have devoted their lives to serving for religion, and our great nation who have constructed and improved mosques. We will organize a symposium on the place of the Grand Hagia Sophia Mosque in our worship and knowledge history, the opening of which we celebrated with great enthusiasm and happiness.

I pray to Allah (swt) that the Mosques and Religious Officials Week be auspicious. I would like to conclude this Friday's khutbah with the following hadith of Prophet Muhammad (saw): "The places most favorable to Allah are mosques."³

Honorable Muslims!

In the verse I have recited, Allah the Almighty states, "He is with you wherever you are. And Allah, of what you do, is Seeing."¹

In the hadith I have read, the Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, "Ihsan is to worship Allah as if you see Him, and if you do not achieve this state of devotion, then (take it for granted that) Allah sees you."²

Dear Believers!

Allah the Almighty has not left human, as the apple of the eye of the universe, on their own and unattended. Human is always under a divine inspection and supervision. All our deeds keep being recorded for us to give an account of them when the time comes. This fact is referred to in the Holy Qur'an as follows: "Man does not utter any word except that with him is an observer prepared [to record]."³

Dear Muslims!

The world is the cropland of the Hereafter. Whoever comes here leaves one day and every servant of Allah reaps what they sow. So, whoever does an atom's weight of good will see it. And whoever does an atom's weight of evil will see it in the Hereafter.⁴ Our Lord (swt) commands us to prepare for the Hereafter by stating, **"O you who** have believed, fear Allah, and let every soul look to what it has put forth for tomorrow."⁵ He (swt) calls on us to muraqabah (to be self-aware), namely question ourselves (through muhasabah) by turning to our inner worlds.

Muraqabah means to ask ourselves why we are created, where we come from, and where we are

going. It means to put effort to keep a record of our mistakes and sins, and to make up for them. It means to live with the awareness that Allah is with us at all times. It means to derive strength from our faith, use our reason, and control our nafs. It means to always stay alert in order not to lose ourselves in Satan's traps and the world's unending desires. Muraqabah means to attach our hearts to Allah, worship sincerely, and race in benevolence and piety.

Dear Believers!

The capital of a Muslim's life is to live by knowing oneself and relying on Allah (swt). Those who draw lessons from the past, know today's value, and plan their future with faith and ihsan reach maturity. In this respect, Prophet Muhammad's following words call on us to self-questioning: **"The feet of the son of Adam shall not move from before his Lord on the Day of Judgement, until he is asked about five things: about his life and what he did with it, about his youth and what he wore it out in, about his wealth and how he earned it and spent it upon, and what he did with what he knew.**"⁶

Dear Muslims!

As I conclude this Friday's khutbah, I would like to remind you that we also need to question ourselves about the fight against the pandemic disease. What falls upon us in this fight is to act conscientiously. This is because both the measures taken and our determination to observe them are critically important. Let us not fall into complacency and negligence. Let us heed the warnings so that we can be sure not to have violated the rights of other people. Let us not waste all the efforts made from the onset of the pandemic to the present. I would like to take this opportunity to pray that Allah the Almighty may accept all our brothers and sisters, particularly our health professionals, who have passed away during the fight against the pandemic, as martyrs, and wish that He (swt) may grant our patients speedy recovery.

Let us not restrain our smiling face, nice words, conscientiousness and tolerance from primarily our spouse and children, and all other people. This way we can make life easier both for ourselves and for the people around us.

Dear Muslims!

As I conclude this Friday's khutbah, I would like to wish the Almighty Allah's mercy upon our Azerbaijani brothers and sisters who were martyred, and speedy recovery for those injured in the struggle to liberate the occupied territories of Azerbaijan.

The Almighty Allah (swt) states in the verse I have recited, **"O you who have believed, when** you rise to [perform] prayer, wash your faces and your forearms to the elbows and wipe over your heads and wash your feet to the ankles."¹

BODY, PEACE FOR SOUL

In the hadith I have read, Prophet Muhammad (saw) says, **"The key of paradise is prayer, and the key of prayer is wudu (being purified).**"²

Dear Believers!

According to Islam, cleanliness is an indispensable responsibility that has its root in faith. Our sublime religion calls on people to purification who want to have a clean body, a peaceful heart, and a soul purified of sins. It therefore asks servants of Allah to stand before Him (swt) in a clean and pure form and manner through getting rid of material and spiritual impurities.

Dear Muslims!

Muslims view wudu both as an act that earns them merits of worship and as a blessing that protects them from uncleanliness and contamination. They start preparing for prayer, the pillar of the religion and the ascent of the soul, with wudu. They perform wudu before reciting the Holy Qur'an. They do not perform tawaf around the Ka'bah without wudu in place. Muslims thus clean, at least five times a day, their parts that get dirtied most, and become the addressee of the following glad tiding of Prophet Muhammad (saw): **"Whoever performs wudu and performs it well, their sins leave the body, through their fingers."**³

Dear Believers!

We are in an all-out fight as a nation against the COVID-19 pandemic that affects the whole world. The key to success in this struggle is through hygiene, wearing face masks, and observing social distancing. Let us not forget that wudu is the best opportunity for us to ensure regular and careful hygiene. We are the members of a very clean culture who grew up with the habit of performing wudu since childhood. The phrase "breaking the wudu" widely used in our language is an expression of the importance attached by our people to "being in state of wudu" all day.

Wudu, which gives cleanliness to our body and peace to our soul, is also the best protection against pandemic diseases. It helps us become a healthier society due to natural purification that comes with water. Then, let us make hygiene and purity ensured by wudu a part of our lives. As expressed in the Holy Qur'an, "Allah loves those who are constantly repentant and loves those who purify themselves."⁴
