Dear Muslims!

We have countless brothers and sisters who spend their lives in the service of our sublime religion, Islam, our homeland, and our nation, in line with the principle of سَتَعْمُهُمْ لِلنَّاسِ أَنفَعُهُمْ لِلنَّاسِ

among You is the one who Benefits People.² How sad it is, however, to witness acts of violence against our valiant soldiers who defend our country, our law

enforcement officers who keep the peace in our society, the healthcare professionals to whom we entrust our lives as well as civilians and government officials who provide services to the nation. While no living being should be exposed to violence, it burns and tears our hearts when our brothers and sisters selflessly serving our great nation and country are subjected to injustices and acts of violence.

Dear Believers!

We are believers who believe in Allah (swt) and the Day of Judgment. As required by our faith, we are liable to reflect the Islamic morals on our life. Violence, mercilessness, hate, injustice, oppression, and attempts on one's life and property have no place in the life of a believer. The morality of a believer is based on love, respect, trust, and respect for the rights of others.

Dear Muslims!

Let us heed our Prophet's (saw) saying, "You will not enter Paradise until you have faith and you will not have faith until you love each other."³, and always uphold love, compassion, and mercy.

Let us have as our principle the hadith إنَّق الله الله

I would like to conclude this Friday's khutbah with our Prophet's (saw) following hadith, "The Muslim is the one from whose tongue and hand the people are safe. And the believer is the one from whom the people's lives and wealth are safe."⁵
