In this aspect, it is either a careless phrase said or inconsiderate conduct that undermines trust, destroys social harmony, pits siblings against one another, or leads couples to divorce.

Our Lord (swt) states in the Holy Qur'an as follows, "And indeed, [appointed] over you are keepers. Noble and recording. They know whatever you do."⁴

So, let us let our lives be a reflection of our religion. Let us prepare for the Day of Resurrection when Allah the Almighty (swt) will address every one of us as follows:
